New Years is more than at time of resolutions. It is a time of renewing one's covenant as a disciple of Jesus Christ. On December 31 we did just that. We celebrated a special covenant service of worship and renewed our commitment to serve God. This is an annual event that is important for all disciples of Jesus Christ to participate in and recommit themselves to serving God.


NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION LESSON

Scripture: Luke 10:25-37, The Good Samaritan

Objective: Kids will make a resolution to do one thing – just one – to help other people this year.

Synopsis: People think of themselves when New Year's Day arrives and ask, "What can I do to make myself better?" This year, why not ask, "How can I make life better for other people?" God wants us to love others with our actions so they can see Jesus in us.

EMOTIONS SERIES OUTLINE

Loving God From The Inside Out

We think of some emotions as good and others as bad. But God made every part of us, and no matter how we are feeling, we can turn to Him.

Lessons:

Anger – James 1:19-27, Listening And Doing

We all get upset and angry sometimes, but kids will learn that we need to be slow to anger so our emotions don't get out of control.

Fear – Mark 4:35-41, Jesus Calms The Storm

Most of the time we'll do whatever we can not to feel fear, but kids will learn that when we are afraid we can tell God what's scaring us and he will comfort us.

Disgust – Luke 17:11-19, Jesus Heals Ten Lepers

When we see things we don't like or understand we may feel disgust, but kids will learn that Jesus loves everyone – even those others find disgusting.

Sadness – John 11:17-44, Jesus Raises Lazarus From The Dead

No one likes to feel sad, but kids will learn that sadness can lead us to seek out Jesus, which is the best place we could ever go.


Joy – Luke 19:1-9 Zacchaeus meets Jesus and finds JOY

Joy is the emotion that makes us feel the best, and kids will learn that when we walk with Jesus he will transform our anger, sadness, disgust and fear into a celebration of JOY.



