May God bless your home and may all that God has placed in your care receive His blessing.





Every life gets messy at times. Sometimes these messes are literal, like a house that would be easier to condemn than to clean. But sometimes they are intangible messes such as illness, conflict, depression, abuse, bankruptcy, divorce, and job loss. And these messes can be painful, hurting our hearts and our homes. But as we see in the Bible, God loves to use messy people!

In this six-week study, we will dig into the lives of biblical heroes who were messy people just like us but who were used by God in powerful ways. Together we will examine the stories of five wonderful but messy people and one messy parable character: Rahab, the Prodigal Son, Josiah, Mary, David, and Daniel. From their stories, we will learn how God can use broken people, restore damaged hearts and relationships, give us power to handle our critics, and help us deal with the hard moments of life. Along the way, we'll discover that we don't have to just endure messy lives but can actually learn to thrive with God's guidance and help.

Week 2: The Prodigal Son: Restoring Messy Relationships (Luke 15: 11-32)


Week 3: Josiah: Breaking Messy Family Cycles (2 Kings 22-23; 2 Chronicles 34-35)

The Harbinger opens with the appearance of a man burdened with a message he has received from a mysterious figure called The Prophet. The Prophet has given him nine seals, each containing a message about America s future. As he tells of his encounters with the Prophet, from a skyscraper in New York City, to a rural mountaintop, to Capitol Hill, to Ground Zero, the mystery behind each seal is revealed. As the story unfolds, each revelation becomes another piece in a larger and larger puzzle, the ramifications of which are, even now, altering the course of America and the world.

Join us as we read this book together and study with one another. This will take place during our Wednesday small group time at 3:30.

SERIES OVERVIEW - Finding Treasure Along the Romans Road

The Romans Road is a way of understanding why we as people need to be saved, and how we can accept Jesus as our Savior. It is called the Romans

Road because all of the Scripture references are found in the book of Romans, Paul's letter to the Roman church. In this series, kids and youth will travel down the Romans Road – learning life-giving verses along the way – on a journey from sin and separation from God, to peace and eternal life with God. An X, or rather a cross, marks the spot for the greatest treasure anyone could ever find – eternal life with Jesus. They will learn that salvation through Jesus is the ultimate treasure.

WEEKLY LESSONS & MEMORY VERSES

1-Quick Sand - Scripture: Romans 3:23

God is perfect and his ways are perfect. Every one of us have sinned — disobeyed and acted in ways that fell short of God's perfection. We have all sinned and fallen short of God's perfection.

"Everyone has sinned. No one measures up to God's glory." - Romans 3:23 NIrV





2-Walking In The Dark - Scripture: Romans 6:23a

If you've ever disobeyed your mom and dad and gotten a time out, you know what a consequence is. A consequence is the punishment for doing the wrong thing. The Bible tells us that sin - disobeying God - has a consequence as well. The consequence is to be apart from God forever. Since we have all sinned, we all deserve that same punishment. Everyone has sinned, and sin comes with a consequence.

"When you sin, the pay you get is death." - Romans 6:23a NIrV

3-A Light Up Ahead – Scripture: Romans 6:23b

We all deserve the consequence for the sin that we have committed. But God loves us and has provided another way, the way of life. Jesus came and took our consequence for us, so we didn't have to experience it. God offers us the gift of life. "When you sin, the pay you get is death. But God gives you the gift of eternal life. That's because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has done." — Romans 6:23 NIrV






4-Clear Path – Scripture: Romans 10:9

Salvation - which means being free from the eternal consequence of sin - comes only from God. Romans 10:9 tells us how we can all receive salvation. To be saved, we must put our faith in Jesus.

"Say with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord.' Believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. Then you will be saved." – Romans 10:9 NIrV



When we put our faith in Jesus, he makes us right with God and brings us peace. We have peace because we know that even though we make mistakes, God forgives us because Jesus paid our sin price for us. Our faith in Jesus makes us right with God. "We have been made right with God because of our faith. Now we have peace with him because of our Lord Jesus Christ." — Romans 5:1 NIrV





6-Treasure - Scripture: Romans 8:38-39

When we find Jesus, we find a treasure. One that no one can ever take away for eternity. Salvation is a treasure that lasts. "I am absolutely sure that not even death or life can separate us from God's love. Not even angels or demons, the present or the future, or any powers can separate us. Not even the highest places or the lowest, or anything else in all creation can separate us. Nothing at all can ever separate us from God's love. That's because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has one."

Remember, Reflect, Rejoice

"Easter is a season of remembrance, reflection, and rejoicing. We ponder the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, we praise God for the miracle of the resurrection, and we prepare our hearts for His promised return. We will celebrate everything Easter embodies with Is He Worthy." The words above are an excerpt from the publisher's description of the cantata that the JUMC choir will present on April 25th. Some may ask, "Why so late?" Well, there are several "Sundays of Easter" in our liturgical calendar. Since this year has been one of a challenge for our own children, asking them to perform technical tasks with which they were, at first, uncomfortable, I wanted to find a date that allowed all our volunteers who also sing in the choir the opportunity to focus entirely on the cantata. In planning worship, Brother Walter and I discussed an option that would enable the sound system technicalities to be handled by someone not in the choir. For me, I also feel it gives us all an extended opportunity to continue the resurrection celebration. This Lent and Easter, I pray that you have had the chance to experience the three R's in the description above. Through the cantata's music on April 25th, the choir will remember the days and weeks leading to Easter, reflect on the depth of God's love for us and the suffering and death of Jesus Christ, and rejoice as we celebrate our risen Savior who came to pay our debts!

Just because our cantata preparations are coming to an end does not mean that there is not a need for people to come make a joyful noise! The choir will continue to meet weekly on Wednesdays to prepare music for worship each Sunday. There are also other opportunities to participate in the music ministry of our church. Our children and youth are invited to participate in our praise music each week. On Sunday mornings at 9:15 before Sunday school, we meet in the sanctuary to sing through our music for the service. We will also begin to work on an opportunity for our children and youth to share with you in worship more regularly. We would love to invite anyone who feels led by the Spirit to join us for our chancel choir on Wednesdays at 5:30 or to sing with us on Sunday mornings before Sunday school.

The music available through contemporary Christian artists and being able to continue to "lead" music throughout 2020 allowed me to worship through it...through the struggles of the lockdowns, through the disappointments of the "not normal", even through the loss of my grandmother. I am grateful to God for the gift of song, for without it, I would have felt a bit lost this last year! I pray that the Lord places a song in your heart and His praise on your lips...and, if you feel the Spirit's nudge, willingness to serve Him through music at JUMC.
