

# APRIL 11th, 18th, 25th & May 1st, 16th, & 23rd:

SERIES OVERVIEW - Finding Treasure Along the Romans Road The Romans Road is a way of understanding why we as people need to be saved, and how we can accept Jesus as our Savior. It is called the Romans Road because all of the Scripture references are found in the book of Romans, Paul's letter to the Roman church. In this series, kids and youth will travel down the Romans Road - learning life-giving verses along the way on a journey from sin and separation from God, to peace and eternal life with God. An X, or rather a cross, marks the spot for the greatest treasure anyone could ever find - eternal life with Jesus. They will learn that salvation through

Jesus is the ultimate treasure.

1-Quick Sand – Scripture: Romans 3:23 God is perfect and his ways are perfect. Every one of us have sinned - disobeyed and acted in ways that fell short of God's perfection. We have all sinned and fallen short of God's perfection. "Everyone has sinned. No one measures up to God's glory." – Romans 3:23 NIrV





### -----2-Walking In The Dark - Scripture: Romans 6:23a

If you've ever disobeyed your mom and dad and gotten a time out, you know what a consequence is. A consequence is the punishment for doing the wrong thing. The Bible tells us that sin - disobeying God - has a consequence as well. The consequence is to be apart from God forever. Since we have all sinned, we all deserve that same punishment. Everyone has sinned, and sin comes with a consequence.

### 3-A Light Up Ahead – Scripture: Romans 6:23b

### 4-Clear Path – Scripture: Romans 10:9

Salvation - which means being free from the eternal consequence of sin - comes only from God. Romans 10:9 tells us how we can all receive salvation. To be saved, we must put our faith in Jesus.

"Say with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord.' Believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. Then you will be saved." - Romans 10:9 NIrV

# 5-A Place To Rest – Scripture: Romans 5:1

When we put our faith in Jesus, he makes us right with God and brings us peace. We have peace because we know that even though we make mistakes, God forgives us because Jesus paid our sin price for us. Our faith in Jesus makes us right with God. "We have been made right with God because of our faith. Now we have peace with him because of our Lord Jesus Christ." - Romans 5:1 NIrV



### 6-Treasure - Scripture: Romans 8:38-39

When we find Jesus, we find a treasure. One that no one can ever take away for eternity. Salvation is a treasure that lasts. "I am absolutely sure that not even death or life can separate us from God's love. Not even angels or demons, the present or the future, or any powers can separate us. Not even the highest places or the lowest, or anything else in all creation can separate us. Nothing at all can ever separate us from God's love. That's because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has one." Romans 8:38-39 NIrV

- Would you be willing to sponsor a new member by buying their book?


Over the summer, would you like to plan a gathering at a time outside of Sunday morning to invite the women of our church and explore ideas to include them?

# JUMC Women's Book Study



Is it possible... That there exists an ancient mystery that holds the secret of America's future? That this mystery lies behind everything from 9/11 to the collapse of the global economy?

That ancient harbingers of judgment are now manifesting in America?

That God is sending America a prophetic message of what is yet to come?

Before its end as a nation, there appeared in ancient Israel nine specific warnings and omens of national destruction – These same nine Harbingers are now manifesting in America with profound ramifications for America's future and end-time prophecy. You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You. — Isaiah 26:3


Dear God, your ways are perfect. Your will is good. You deserve all praise.
