

Sunday School Series



Don't you believe it!

There are many lies going around today that sound good, but are really leading people away from the truth. However, if we look to Scripture we'll find reasons to believe the Bible and reasons to do things God's way. We will receive Biblical answers to big lies.

Memory Verse: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." 2 Timothy 3:16 (NIV)

Lesson 1: You Are Number One Mark 9:33-35, Who is the Greatest

This big lie tells us we should put ourselves first. Get ahead at all costs. Look out for number one, and number one is you. Jesus teaches us that if we want to be great, we will serve others. We will learn that God wants us to put others first.

Lesson 2: There's No Such Thing as Right and Wrong 2 Timothy 3, Follow the Bible and Not the World

One of the biggest lies told today is that there's no such thing as right and wrong. There are no absolutes. That can't be true because "There are no absolutes" is itself an absolute statement! The Bible teaches us there is absolute truth, as well as right and wrong. We will learn that the Bible teaches us right and wrong.

Lesson 3: The Bible is a Myth Matthew 27:11-26, Jesus Before Pilate

This big lie tells us the Bible is a myth or a fairy tale. There's not only Biblical evidence to show the Bible is true, there is archaeological evidence to back up the Bible. It is a book rooted in real history that teaches us who we are and what God has done for us! We will learn the Bible is a true book of history as well as a revelation about God.

Lesson4: There's More Than One Way to Heaven John 14:5-6, Jesus is the Way

The big lie says all religions are essentially the same. They all lead to the same place. This lie is as dangerous as telling a driver that any direction they drive on a road is safe. That's a great way to have a head on collision! Jesus says He is the ONLY way to be saved. Only by believing in Jesus can we get to Heaven. To tell someone otherwise is not being "tolerant" or "kind". It's actually one of the most unloving things you can do. We will learn Jesus is the only way to Heaven.

Youth Rising Sunday Study



A True Hope Idea: Helping kids understand the concepts of Sin, Love, Grace, Forgiveness, Belief, and Faithfulness – 6 of the most important words in any galaxy.

Memory Verse: "Life was in him, and that life was the light for all people. The light shines in the darkness. But the darkness has not overcome the light." –John 1:4–5 (NIRV)

Lesson 1: Sin – Genesis 3:1-10, 21-24, The Fall of Man In the beginning, there was only good, but then something bad entered the world. We call that bad thing Sin. Sin is disobeying God and not doing what he says is right.

Lesson 2: Love – John 3:16 For God so loved the world, Matthew 22:36-40 The greatest commandment God's love is a force to be reckoned with. He created the universe and everything in it. He loves every person very much. So much so that he would even send his son to die for us to save us from sin. Love is also the most powerful weapon we have to fight against sin. If we are doing what God says, we are showing love to him and to others. Love is when we think of others before ourselves.

Lesson 3: Grace – Luke 2:1-14, The Birth of Jesus Just when it seemed that sin would be victorious, God gave us the gift of his Son Jesus. He gave us a way to escape sin. Grace means God gave us a way to not be punished for sin when we did not deserve his help.

Lesson 4: Forgiveness – Luke 23:26-43, The Cross A lightsaber can cut through whatever the enemy throws your way. Forgiveness through Jesus is like that lightsaber, cutting through our sin so we are no longer sinful. Forgiveness means God does not punish us like we deserve for our sins, because Jesus took the punishment for us.

Lesson 5: Belief – John 20:1-19, Jesus Is Alive When Jesus died, many thought that sin had won and nothing could stop it. But sin is not stronger than God's love. God raised Jesus to life again in power! If we believe that, Jesus promises to save us from sin and give us eternal life. Belief means we trust that what the Bible says is true

Lesson 6: Faithfulness – Acts 9:1-19, Saul's Conversion In the end, each of us must choose: will we follow the dark path of sin and shame or will we choose to be faithful to Jesus and follow him. Faithfulness means we choose to live life God's way and not sin's way.

Working Together to Bring Peace

Hero Hotline VBS Theme Verse

Romans 14:19: "So let's strive for the things that bring peace and the things that build each other up."

This verse reminds us that God calls us to be a part of a community—working to bring peace to the world is something that we are all called to do together. Here's how Hero Hotline helps Heroes work together to bring peace and build one another up: The Hero Hotline Headquarters is a secret place where Heroes go to help solve problems called in by other heroes out in the community.

At Hero Hotline, everyone's gifts are valued and each Hero has a role to play. Heroes receive a call/assignment each day by the Professor and Super Meer to help solve a problem that other Heroes in the community are facing. Heroes will then explore the files and database of the Hero Hotline to discover how Heroes can work together to bring peace.

Peace comes from God, and as God's people we are called to share that peace with the world. We work together, help one another, and encourage one another because God has called us to live in community and fellowship with one another. We all can strive, in both expected and unexpected ways, to bring peace, love, and justice to the world.

We are in need of adult volunteers for the following:


- Meal preparation/serving


